3rd Crowdworking Symposium

This year, the University of Bremen hosts the 3rd Crowdworking Symposium, which provides an international and interdisciplinary forum for research on on-demand online labor. The symposium is organized by Lars Hornuf (University of Bremen) and supported by the DFG research project *Crowdsourcing as a New Form of Organizing Labor Relations*.

The symposium brings together researchers in the fields of economics, business administration, information systems, innovation, and law. Several sessions provide scholars with the opportunity to present their academic research on topics related to the emerging fields of crowdsourcing, crowdwork, cloudwork, gigwork, online freelancing, and other forms of on-demand labor. Presenters will receive valuable feedback from fellow researchers. The keynote lecture will be delivered by **John Horton** (MIT Sloan School of Management).

Topics include:

- Characteristics, knowledge, skills, and abilities of on-demand workers
- Motivation of on-demand workers
- Reputation mechanisms and price structures
- Platform design and competition
- Regulation of online labor markets
- Opportunities and risks of on-demand labor

Please send your paper or extended abstract to **crowdworking@uni-bremen.de** by **July 1, 2021**. Authors will be informed about the outcome of their submission by August 1, 2021. The symposium is free of charge and will take place virtually.
