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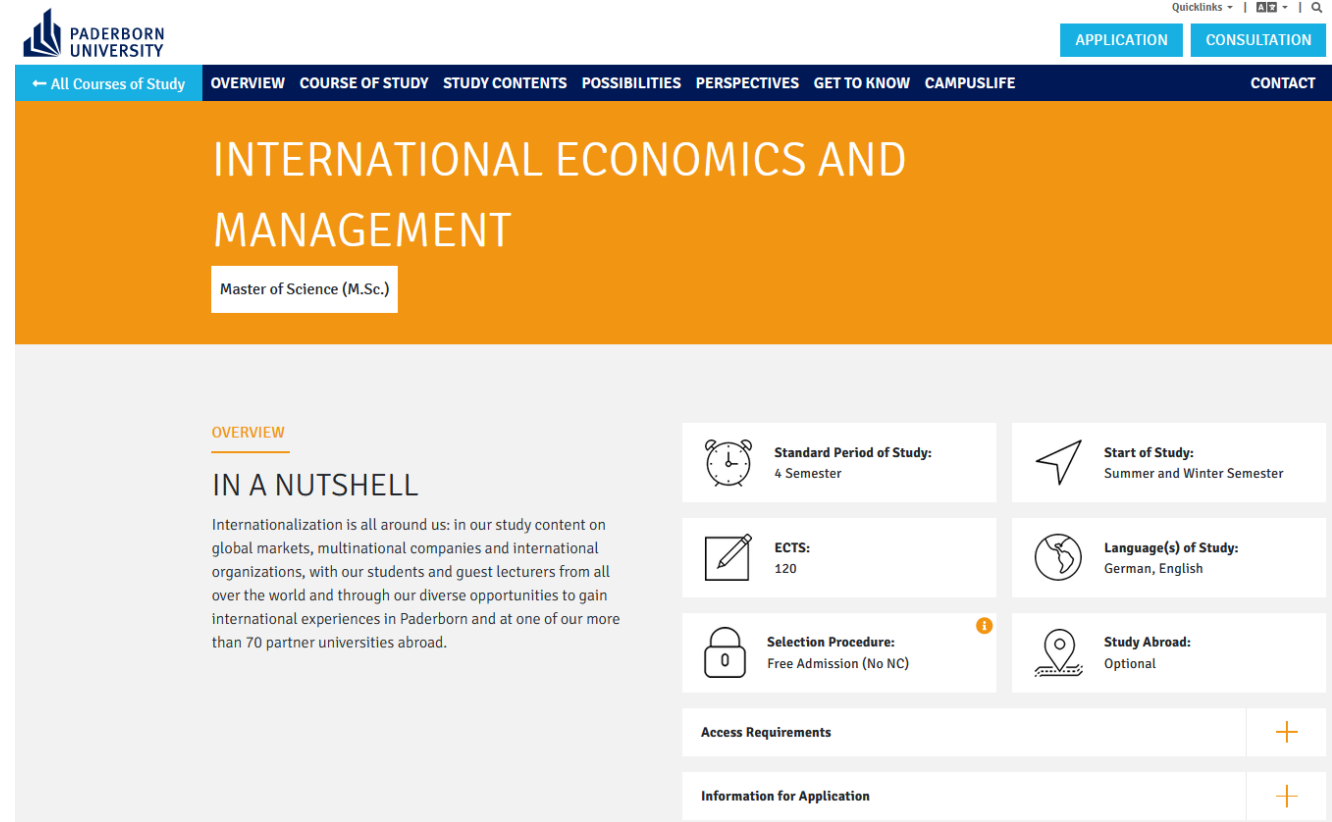

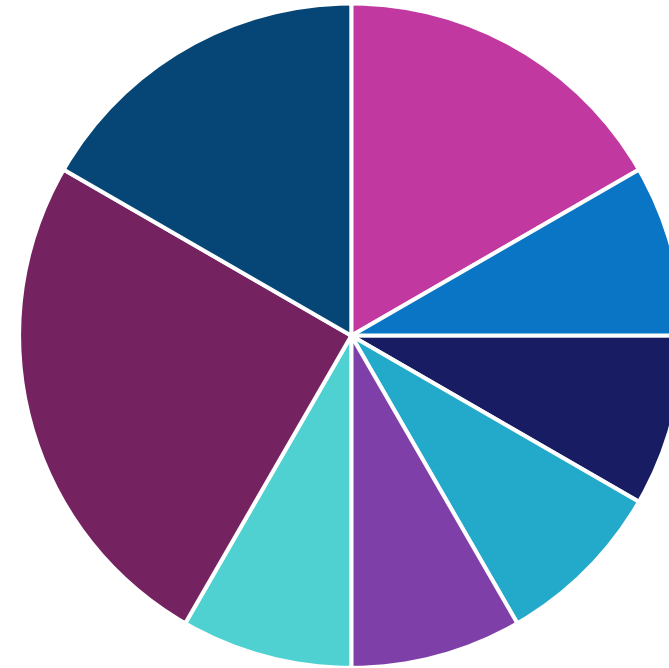

In particular, the faculty points out that information regarding "Weighting for the overall grade" is relevant for those students studying the Bachelor's degree programmes "B.Sc. International Business Studies", "B.Sc. in Business Information Systems and B.Sc. in Business Administration and Economics (not B.Sc. in Sports Economics) only. These students have been enrolled since Winter Semester 15/16 or a later semester. For all students who were enrolled before Winter Semester 15/16 each module is simply weighted in a lump sum.

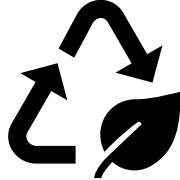


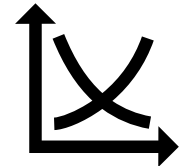

Study Tracks (Focus Areas)

Please note:

You need to decide for one of the Study Tracks. Each Study Track has specific modules assigned to it (specialization area).

As soon as you register for one of the assigned modules in PAUL, you choose one of the Study Tracks. From this point on, the other Study Tracks will no longer be available for you.

It is possible to change the Study Track once, provided that you did not fail one of the modules from the previous Study Track. All modules completed prior to the change will be transferred to the new Study Track, unless it could not have been completed in the new Study Track.

Hint:

→ Don't start in the first or second semester



Combination of Study Tracks and Other Programs

A study track can be completed together with other study programs such as Double Degree with Tohoku University or ASBE program or other exchange programs.

Courses taken at other universities can be transferred and recognized as courses assigned to a study track as well.

A check of possible courses offered by our partner universities which can be assigned to a study track will be provided on request.

Module Registration

- Course registration **deadlines are binding!**
- After the end of the course registration phase, no course registration is possible anymore!
- **No registration** in PAUL = **no examination** possible
- Registration in PAUL is limited to **max 45 ECTS** (incl. Language Courses, Transition Courses)
- Module selection has to **fit the study plan** (fulfil: Management Electives, Economics Electives, General Electives, Sustainable Elective, Research/Internship Elective, Study Track and Compulsory Courses)



Maximum Number of Module Deselections

- Students may deselect a maximum of **seven elective modules during their studies**
- The individual and current number of deselected modules can be found under “Deselected Modules” in PAUL
- **Modules that have been deselected cannot be selected again**
- Once the limit of seven deselected modules is reached, all subsequently selected modules **must be completed** — further deselection is not possible
- In total, you can only deselect as many ECTS as you are allowed to choose in an elective area.

Important: Please keep this restriction in mind when planning your modules.



Examination and Failure

Examination:

- Passed: with (not worse than) grade 4.0
- Illness: If you are ill at the examination day, you need to hand in a doctor's statement required for that day to the examination office (if you are absent without statement: exam failed)

Failure:

- *Repetition*: No repetition option of module examinations in the same semester
→ New registration for following semester is necessary
 1. Elective Modules: **Two retrials! Exams not passed three times = exmatriculation!**
 2. Compulsory Modules: **Two retrials! Exams not passed three times = exmatriculation!**
- *New module selection*: Alternatively, you can choose a different module (only possible for elective modules)

How to Register for the Conditional Bachelor Thesis / Master Thesis

- In case you want to register for a Bachelor thesis/ Master Thesis, you will need to apply for a supervisor:
 - Organized by the faculty's **central allocation procedure** (starts in **January/February for summer semester** and in **June/July for winter semester**)
 - Please indicate your three *preferred* supervisors (still no guarantee that you get one of these supervisors)
 - Allocation process takes approximately 1 - 1 ½ months
- Once you have been notified about the allocated supervisor, please contact him/her and ask for the individual process.
- If you are not satisfied with the assignment of your supervisor, you can reapply for the next semester. In this case, please inform your supervisor about your withdrawal.

International students need to prove **Germany proficiency level A2** to finish the Study Program MSc IEM

- Level must be proven **before the master thesis is registered**
 - Only the following certificates will be recognized:
 - ✓ Goethe Institution
 - ✓ TestDAF
 - ✓ "Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang" (DSH)
- In case students cannot provide one of the above certificates, the required proficiency can also be acquired in German language courses at Paderborn University

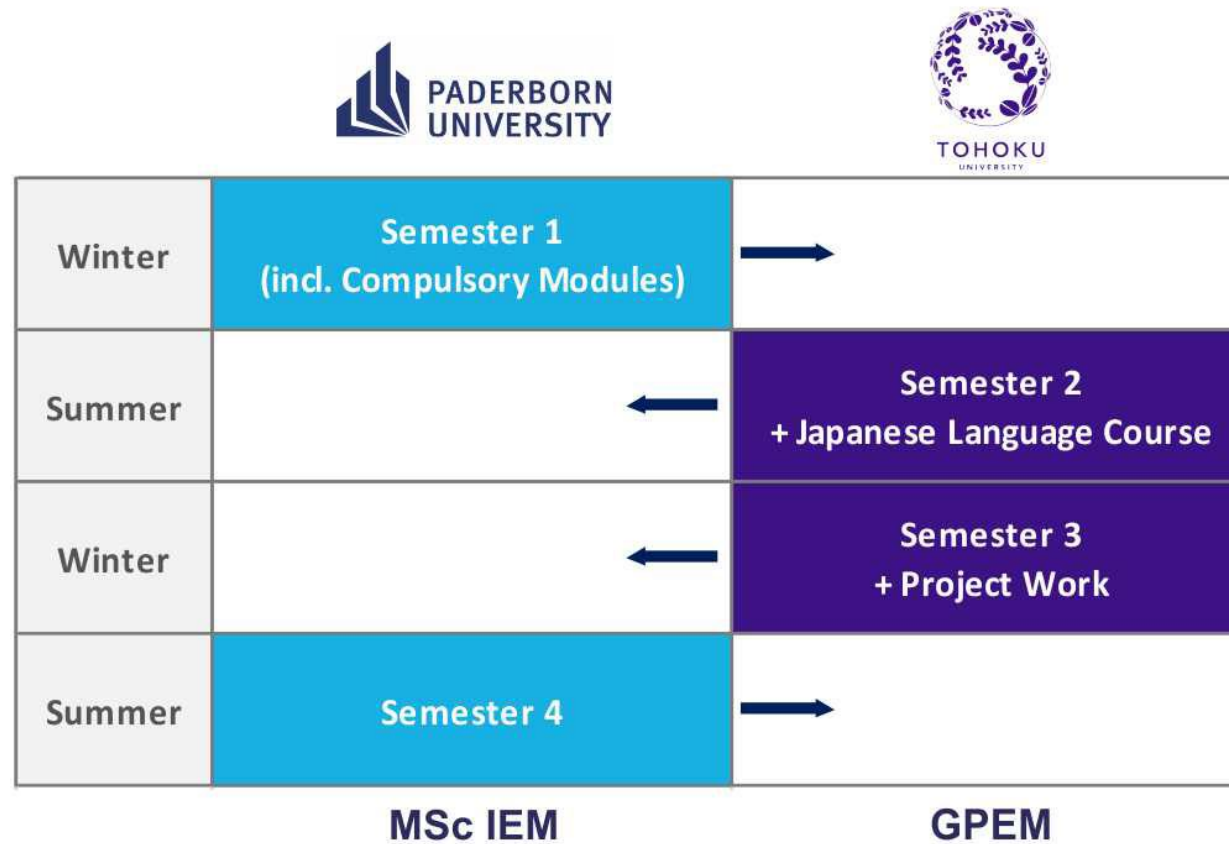

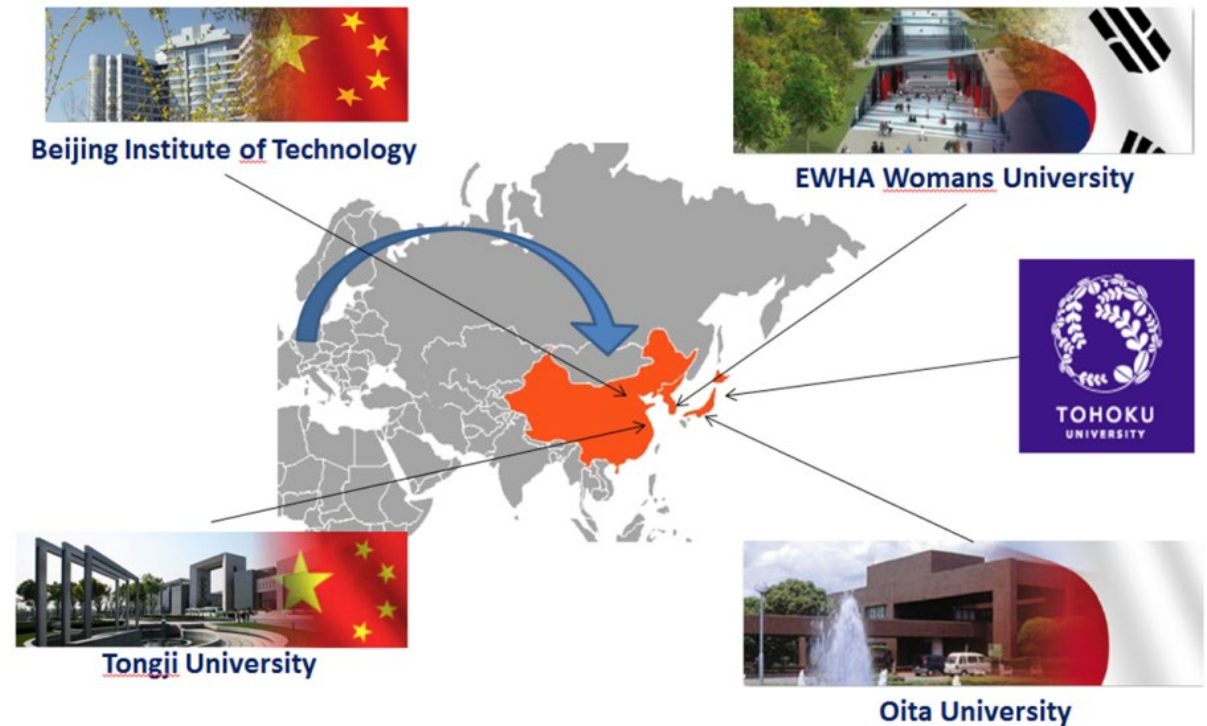
