



The Module Catalogue

Both the relevant semester and degree program can be selected using the dropdown menu provided. Thereafter, an overview of all the modules on offer for this program within the selected semester will be displayed. Both compulsory and optional areas are regulated within your study plan and/or examination regulations. Please take note, during your module selection process, that the module catalogues are based on the faculty's module handbook. The module handbook, valid for the current academic year, is published once a year and is approved by the Fakultätsrat. Module descriptions of previous semesters can be found in the archived module handbooks. In particular, the faculty points out that information regarding "Weighting for the overall grade" is relevant for those students studying the Bachelor's degree programmes "B.Sc. International Business Studies", "B.Sc. in Business Information Systems and B.Sc. in Business Administration and Economics (not B.Sc. in Sports Economics) only. These students have been enrolled since Winter Semester 15/16 or a later semester. For all students who were enrolled before Winter Semester 15/16 each module is simply weighted in a lump sum.



Combination of Study Tracks and Other Programs

A study track can be completed together with other study programs such as Double Degree with Tohoku University or ASBE program or other exchange programs.

Courses taken at other universities can be transferred and recognized as courses assigned to a study track as well.

A check of possible courses offered by our partner universities which can be assigned to a study track will be provided on request.

Important:

Confirmation of the successful completion needs to be requested as soon as...

- the modules assigned to the Study Track have been completed and
- the Master's thesis has been registered

but before the completion of the degree (completion of your last academic achievement).

Module Registration

- Course registration deadlines are binding!
- After the end of the course registration phase, no course registration is possible anymore!
- **No registration** in PAUL = **no examination** possible
- Registration in PAUL is limited to **max 45 ECTS** (incl. Language Courses, Transition Courses)
- Module selection has to fit the study plan (fulfil: Management Electives, Economics Electives, General Electives and Compulsory Courses)





Examination and Failure

Examination:

- Passed: with (not worse than) grade 4.0
- Illness: If you are ill at the examination day, you need to hand in a doctor's statement required for that day to the examination office (if you are absent without statement: exam failed)

Failure:

- Repetition: No repetition option of module examinations in the same semester
 - \rightarrow New registration for following semester is necessary
 - 1. <u>Elective Modules:</u> One retrial! Exams not passed twice = end of study/exmatriculation!
 - 2. <u>Compulsory Modules</u>: One retrial + one 2nd retrial for one of the two compulsory modules
- New module selection: Alternatively you can choose a different module (only possible for elective modules)

Final exams start after the lecture period

Midterms may take place after the registration period

Deregistration until two days before first assessment (at the latest) – please check yourself if two days or one week!
































How to Register for the Conditional Bachelor Thesis / Master Thesis

Important for conditional Master IEM students:

In case you have already written a **Bachelor thesis** and it has not been checked yet, present your thesis in the "Studienbüro" (room Q0.216/ via email: <u>studium@wiwi.uni-paderborn.de</u>)

- In case you want to register for a Bachelor thesis/ Master Thesis, you will need to apply for a supervisor:
 - Organized by the faculty's central allocation procedure (starts in *January/February* for summer semester and in *June/July* for winter semester)
 - Please indicate your three *preferred* supervisors (still no guarantee that you get one of these supervisors)
 - Allocation process takes approximately 1 1 ¹/₂ months
- Once you have been notified about the allocated supervisor, please contact him/her and ask for the individual process.
- If you are not satisfied with the assignment of your supervisor, you can reapply for the next semester. In this case, please inform your supervisor about your withdrawal.

Official registration of the Final thesis (only after alignment with the individual supervisor) needs to be done in PAUL.





German Language Requirements and Courses for International Students

International students need to prove **Germany proficiency level A2** to finish the Study Program MSc IEM

- Level must be proven before the master thesis is registered
- Only the following certificates will be recognized:
 - ✓ Goethe Institution
 - ✓ TestDAF
 - ✓ "Deutsche Sprachpr
 üfung f
 ür den Hochschulzugang" (DSH)
 - ✓ a computer-based test ("C-Test") at Paderborn University
- → In case students cannot provide one of the above certificates, the required proficiency can also be acquired in German language courses at Paderborn University

German Language Requirements and Courses for International Students Crediting

International students can credit German courses as "General electives"

- up to 10 ECTS
- **up to level A2** (no courses with a higher level can be credited!)
- credits will be **counted down from A2** (i.e. the last course that gives level A2 will be considered first)
- grade will be weighted according to the ECTS

Important: If you want to get German courses credited, you need to contact <u>msc-iem@campus.upb.de</u>. Crediting is only possible **until the registration of the master thesis at the latest**. Crediting at later times is not possible.






